INTRODUCTION

Welcome to Annual Conference! We are gathered from across South Carolina for a few days of Christian conferencing. Our work is grounded in worship, a means of grace by which we gather in God's presence and ask God to make us disciples God can use. Over these next few days we will meet God in prayer, in praise, in Sacrament, and in our sisters and brothers. In order to ensure our worship is meaningful, please take a moment to read through this introduction.

Please note, a separate order of worship will be distributed for Monday night's ordination service. There is no printed worship guide for Tuesday night's praise service.

REGARDING PROCESSIONS

Several of our worship services will begin with processions. Once a procession has started, please do not enter the floor of the arena until all those in the procession have taken their places.

In worship services with a recession, please remain in your seat until all those in the recession have left the arena.

RECEIVING COMMUNION AT ANNUAL CONFERENCE

The celebration of Holy Communion is a **sacred** moment of worship regardless of the setting. We are humbly receiving God's grace in the sharing of the Bread and Cup. Please retain this attitude throughout the services by refraining from conversation with your neighbor. Likewise, please restrict your movement to only that necessary to move to the servers and to return to your seat.

The Lord's Table is open to all – if you desire to receive Communion, you are welcome at Christ's Table. The method of serving is by intinction. As you approach the servers, please place your right hand on top of your left hand with palms up and, while making eye contact with your server, extend both hands to receive the bread. Your server will place the bread in your hands with these (or similar) words: "The body of Christ given for you." Your response may be a simple "Amen" or "Thanks be to God."

After receiving the bread move to the server holding the cup. Dip the bread into the cup as it is tilted towards you. A napkin is provided to remove any excess liquid. The server will say the following (or similar) words: "The blood of Christ given for you" and again your response can be a simple "Amen."

Please return to your seat maintaining an attitude of worship as others are continuing to be served.

RECEIVING COMMUNION IN THE MAIN ARENA

There are serving stations throughout the arena. Ushers will be present to direct you to your nearest station. Please follow your usher's instructions allowing the service to move as smoothly and as worshipful as possible. Please note that if you are seated in the burgundy seats – on the floor – your servers will be in front of you and that if you are seated in the teal seats – in the stands – your servers will be behind you.

There will be two stations serving **gluten-free** bread – one at the front of the arena to the left of the stage and one at the right rear of the arena. Please make your own way to the most convenient station and back to your seat.

RECEIVING COMMUNION AT THE 7:30 A.M. SERVICES

In addition to the service of Holy Communion in the arena during our opening worship service, "A Service of Word and Table" will be offered each morning at 7:30 – Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings at 7:30. There will be three stations at each of these services, each of which will have a regular loaf of bread. The station on the congregation's right will have both regular and glutenfree bread. Due to the smaller more intimate settings of these services ushers will not be provided and you will simply cooperate with the other worshippers as you move to the most convenient station to receive the elements in the same manner detailed above.
