#### **Anderson Interfaith Ministries**

The AIM Backpack Program began in 1994 with guidance counselors requesting backpacks and school supplies for students, in need, at their schools. In the spring, AIM sends a letter all the guidance counselors in Anderson County's schools so they can contact us if they wish to participate in our Back to School Program. AIM provides school supplies to children in Anderson County who are less fortunate.

Another program for children through Anderson Interfaith Ministries is Food 4 Kids. During the summer months children in subsidized housing areas do not have the same access to food as they do during the school year. Many schools offer these children free or reduced price breakfast and lunch Monday through Friday. This lack of access to food can strain already tight household budgets in these locations. Given the existence of federally funded weekday feeding programs, we designed our program to focus on providing children with food for the weekend.
