Budget: The yearly budget for Clemson Community Care is approximately \$300,000.00. In 2012, 92% of funds went directly to client services and support. In 2013 Clemson United Methodist Church donated \$9,445.00 to Clemson Community Care.

Description: Clemson Community Care was established in 1988 by pastors in the Clemson area who saw the need for an agency that would be able to coordinate and document assistance to residents in the community rather than people in need of help going from church to church. Churches came together in support of CCC led by Clemson UMC pastor Mickey Fisher and the pastor of Fort Hill Presbyterian Church. Many Clemson UMC members participated in the organization of the agency and have supported CCC through the past 26 years.

Clemson Community Care assists families with basic needs - food, shelter and utilities.

Additional services include back-to-school program where school principals meet with CCC client families to discuss bus routes, school lunch programs and any other questions they may have. Participating families receive a backpack with school supplies.

Clemson UMC participates with Clemson Community Care in many ways. Clemson UMC supports CCC financially. The director of CCC is a member of Clemson UMC. Many of the regular volunteers at CCC are also members of Clemson UMC. Clemson UMC youth and children volunteer regularly at CCC and hold food drives in conjunction with some of their programs. Clemson UMC has a permanent drop-off box for food donations and also gives out paper bags for church families to take home, fill and return to church with donations.

This ministry benefits those who need clothing but also provides an opportunity for church members to serve the Lord through hands on ministry at our own church campus. The ministry blesses not only those who receive the clothes but also those who donate the clothing and those who sort and display the clothing so our clients have a super "shopping" experience. Clients leave with new outfits, needed household items and uplifted spirits. Volunteers leave tired but with a sense of fulfillment, knowing they have put their faith into action.

A few years back we had a homeless person (no longer homeless!) who started attending Hibben. She made us more aware of the plight of the folks in the immediate area around our church campus. So we began our ministry by walking the neighborhoods in our immediate area where there is subsidized housing and a few trailer neighborhoods.

Each third Saturday of the month, from 11 AM to 1 PM, we open up our Christian Life and Learning Center to offer a free meal, bags of groceries, and free haircuts (and sometimes

manicures). We also offer activities for the children in the families we serve - Storytime, double dutch and other games, and face painting.

Any given month we have our "regulars", as well as new friends who come to join us. For our members, it has offered a way for us to reach out to our neighbors in need, when we might not otherwise have a way to do that. I believe it has opened the eyes of some of our members as to how much poverty is so close by.

We have a regular group of volunteers who have found The Table ministry to be the service that God has called them to. We see this being a long-term ministry at Hibben - praise God!

Murray Community Medical Clinic implements checking blood pressure in the clinic on a regular basis. Patients are required to keep a log of their weekly blood pressure values and bring those values to clinic. During their clinical visit, the clinician will review the patient's log for signs of high blood pressure. Diabetes is the seventh leading cause of death in South Carolina. Murray Community Medical Clinic provides needed healthcare to diabetics to increase their chances of healthier living. African Americans are twice as likely to die of breast cancer as Caucasian women who have cancer. Murray Community Medical Clinic educates the community about the above mentioned risk factors for breast cancer and all other risk factors and provides primary and preventative health care to the community.

Every first Saturday all who come to the Manna Station are fed both physically and spiritually. A service is rendered and communion is served. Our guests receive a full course meal that includes salad, desert and beverage, as well as a to-go food bag. At Christmas, in addition to a meal, a gift bag is given consisting of basic necessities (toiletries, hat, socks, etc.) Our Manna Station guests are much like our Food Pantry customers in that they come from all walks of life as some are homeless, and some are down on their luck and in need of a good meal and fellowship. Our guests vary in age, gender, and race in that we serve men, women, children, seniors, and even babies in strollers have come through our doors. We currently serve an average of 75-100 guests. This ministry is well supported by Wesley adults, youth and children, members of churches of various denominations and college students. Several of our guests have become regular church attendees and some have joined our membership.

FOOD PANTRY

Over the last 10 plus years, Wesley has helped to feed the community by operating the Food Pantry. This ministry allows Wesley to serve the homeless, transits, and individuals who needs assistance to feed themselves, children and even grandchildren.

The Food Pantry is operated by Church volunteers and is funded by monetary contributions and food donations from members and friends. Food Distribution is twice a week on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 10:30 to 12:30. Our volunteers custom packs the bags to accommodate those with large families and those who require ready-to-serve items as they have no means to heat or cook food. An average of 40-45 bags of groceries, consisting of non-perishable food items, are distributed within the four hours of the weekly operation.

Ministry Description: The Mission of the Greenville Area Interfaith Hospitality Network (GAIHN) is to assist local congregations to share hospitality (in the form of emergency shelter, meals, and short-term housing) with homeless families that include children, and to help those families achieve self-sufficiency and self-fulfillment. GAIHN is the only homeless shelter in Greenville County that counts among its goals to keep families together. It is the only shelter for families of mixed genders where children are over the age of 12. Comprises the only homeless shelter for single fathers.

The Greenville Area IHN is a coalition of forty-two religious congregations (including 13 UM churches) collectively called GAIHN (Greenville Area Interfaith Hospitality Network). Uniting volunteers and facilities from diverse religious communities and faith traditions, GAIHN provides homeless families with safe, secure shelter while offering emergency assistance (including superb transitional housing), strategies to obtain affordable housing and permanent employment, and appropriate referral and guidance to help reintegrate families into the community as quickly as possible.

Ministry Budget: The BCACM currently has a budget of \$85,000 which encompasses funds received via member churches, pledges, mission support from the SC Conference, and General Board of Global Ministry.

Ministry Description:

The Bennettsville-Cheraw Area Cooperative Ministry (BCACM) is a specialized ministry of the South Carolina Conference that was established in 1966 to help facilitate the needs of persons living in Marlboro & Chesterfield counties of South Carolina in a shared ministry and vision. The churches that are affiliated with this ministry are Aaron Temple United Methodist Church, Bethel United Methodist Church, Ebenezer United Methodist Church, Level Green United Methodist Church, Mount Zion United Methodist Church, Shiloh United Methodist Church, Smyrna United Methodist Church, Saint Michael United Methodist Church, and Trinity United Methodist Church. The churches that are affiliated with the BCACM have a combined membership less than 2500. In the initial development of the BCACM, the churches had a vision that ministry could be enhanced through shared efforts. Thus, under the direction of the Sixty-Six Conference Board of Mission, and the leadership of Dr. John H. Graham, J.W. Curry, Jasper Smith, a team of conference ministers and a committee from the aforementioned churches, formed the BCACM.

Ministry Description: The BIG (Believe In God) Garden is a Mission of the Bethel Youth to assist the local GPS Food Center with fresh vegetables for needy families in the community surrounding the church. Ministry Description: At the Ridgeville Charge (Canaan and Sand Hill United Methodist Churches), the call was to start after-school programs for students in conjunction with the local school district, Dorchester School District Two. Rev. Mack C. McClam, pastor of Canaan and Sand Hill, and Dr. A. Sean Alford, Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction for Dorchester District Two Schools, met and determined a way for the school district and the churches to work together to serve the members of the communities surrounding the church. Their plan was to continue with and expand on an idea that was started several years ago. The school district and charge planned to implement an after school tutoring and enrichment program for students in the communities surrounding the churches. One reason that this charge was a perfect location to pilot this program is that both churches are in rural communities with a high rate of students on free/reduced lunch. At the initial planning meeting, the district and the charge determined the needs for a successful program. The district provided computers, educational software, snacks, transportation to the sites from schools, and furniture, if needed. The church provided internet access, volunteers to help the students, space, books, and equipment for free time during rotations. The focus group was students from Pre-K to 8th grade. Principals at the schools who served the two communities were contacted, and information was shared appropriately with parents. Parents then registered students with members of the task force, who sent out letters, called, and emailed parents to keep them informed. Currently, both sites have met their maximum number of students, 25, and have waiting lists. Each church has a site coordinator and an assistant site coordinator who ensure that there are volunteers in place and themselves assist with students and program logistics.

Ministry Description: Let's Serve is a 5 week program for young children consisting of tennis lessons and mission outreach projects, providing service to others through St. Andrew UMC's Bluffton campus. Based on the Christian Upward Basketball and Soccer program, Let's Serve adds an additional component of "service"...actively involving the children in mission outreach service projects. Tennis pros, provided by the church, teach the children how to play tennis, and mid-way, a 10-minute devotion time, combined with a service element is held. Devotion time involves all the kids and parents together. The smaller kids learn tennis between 1:30-3:00 and the older kids 2:30-4:30...devotion time overlaps so all ages participate in the devotion and service projects together.

The first week's devotion centered on the subject of service – how to serve God, who to serve, what it means to serve God. The next week follow-up service element was the collection of gently-used clothing from home or from friends. The children separated clothes and put them in boxes which were delivered to Bluffton Self-Help. The second week's devotion was of Jesus taking the fish and loaves to feed the 5,000. The next week follow-up service was a collection of canned foods, with the SABTS's Soup Kitchen and a Soup Kitchen in North Carolina being the recipients. The third week's devotion was about loving God with all your heart, mind, soul-loving your neighbor. The next service element was putting together UMCOR Layette Kits. This year, about 6 layette kits were completed, then sent to the UMCOR distribution center. The final week of the program, the Let's Serve devotion was a review and recap of the ways they (children and parents) had been engaged in mission outreach service to others during the Let's Serve season.
