INFORMATION BOOTH – Will assist you in finding --when and where events will occur.

QUIET PLEASE – We ask that you help us create a proper setting for work and worship by taking conversations outside the arena during work sessions and worship services.

REPORTS CONTINUED FROM PRE CONFERENCE MATERIALS

THE COMMITTEE ON STANDING RULES

The Committee on Standing Rules moves that the Annual Conference amend the noted Standing Rules as follows:

Standing Rule 47 will be amended by addition as follows:

47. In making nominations for Boards of Trustees, it is recommended that parent boards or agencies (CCOCM, BHECM, EDUCATION, BHW, GLOBAL MINISTRIES) within the framework of the institution's charter (if applicable) maintain at least 25% ethnic minority representation; and when vacancies are filled, at least 25% ethnic minority representation be maintained in the total number of members. It is further recommended that until this representation is achieved, if from one to four members are to be elected, at least one be an ethnic minority person; if five to eight members are to be elected, at least two be ethnic minority persons. Nominations from the floor of the session shall comply with the recommended representation. Further, in presenting nominations for Boards of Trustees, parent boards or agencies shall identify any nominee who is not a member of The United Methodist Church by indicating the denominational or religious affiliation of the person being nominated in parentheses following his or her name.

Rationale: To clearly indicate the denominational or religious affiliation of the person being nominated so that the body has full disclosure of the affiliation of persons being elected to positions of leadership in our annual conference.

Standing Rule 49 will be amended by striking the word fifty-seven and replacing it with sixty-five:

49. The Board of Ordained Ministry shall be composed of fifty-seven (57) sixty-five (65) members. In accordance with *The Discipline*, no less than one-fifth (1/5) and no more than one-third (1/3) of the total membership shall be lay persons. The Annual Conference Coordinator of Clergy Services shall be an ex-officio member, with voice, but without vote. If the Psychological Assessment Vendor is United Methodist, the vendor may serve as an ex-officio member of the Board with voice but without vote, in accordance with the nominating process of *The Book of Discipline*.

Rationale: There are board members who have significant administrative roles and responsibilities on the board, and who also serve as readers on our four primary committees. We need to relieve these board members of the reading duties in order to enable them to carry out the administrative functions. The additional eight board members will serve as readers on the four primary committees.

Standing Rule 65.b will be amended by deletion.

65. There shall be a Committee on the Conference Journal composed of nine (9) persons nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. It is recommended that three (3) be clerical members and six (6) lay members. The following shall be ex-officio members: the Conference Secretary; the First Assistant Conference Secretary; the Editor of the *South Carolina United Methodist Advocate*; and the Statistician.

a. The Committee shall cooperate with the Conference Secretary in the publication of the pre-conference reports.

1. The Conference Secretary shall inform the boards, councils, commissions and committees when reports shall be due in order to maintain the printing schedule for the pre-conference reports.

2. No report by any board, council, commission or committee shall be considered by the Annual Conference that has not been distributed to the members of the Annual Conference at least four weeks prior to the Conference session. Excluded from this requirement are the reports of the Board of Ordained Ministry, the Committee on Nominations, and the Committee on Standing Rules.

b. The Committee shall determine the accuracy of the Journal of Proceedings where differences exist.

c. The Committee and the Conference Secretary shall be responsible for the publication annually of the *South Carolina Conference Journal* (see *The Book of Discipline*, Para. 606.3) and shall have the *Journal* ready for the printer at least by October 1st following the close of Annual Conference. The *Journal* shall include the informational reports included in the pre-conference reports, the proceedings and actions of the Annual Conference, and the Statistical Reports.

1. The Secretary of the Annual Conference shall edit the *Conference Journal*.

2. The Committee and the Conference Secretary shall annually request of the Council on Finance and Administration the funds needed to publish and distribute the pre-conference reports and the *Conference Journal*, and shall provide for the printing at least one year in advance.
3. The required number of copies will be sent to those mandated by *The Discipline*. Other copies may be ordered by subscription at a cost to be set by the Committee.
- d. The Committee shall be responsible for the publication every ten years (cycle beginning in 1991) of the volume entitled *United Methodist Ministers in South Carolina*, which shall feature biographical sketches and photographs of the ministers of the South Carolina Conference.
- e. The memoirs of the ministers and ministers' spouses who have died during the conference year shall be printed in the *Conference Journal*; those of the ministers shall not exceed 600 words and those of the spouses shall not exceed 250 words.

Rationale: With the advent of electronic communication, it is no longer feasible to incur such an extreme cost to produce this book.

Standing Rule 68 will be amended by additions as follows:

68. There shall be a Conference Committee on Nominations of twenty-four (24) members composed of two representatives nominated and elected by each district. It is recommended that these be one clergy and one lay representative from each district. The additional members shall include: the resident Bishop; a youth and young adult nominated by the Conference Council on Connectional Ministries; up to six (6) at large members, who may be nominated by the Bishop to ensure adequate representation; and the following members: the Conference Lay Leader or their designee, an elected representative of United Methodist Women, United Methodist Men, the Conference Council on Youth Ministry, a retired member of the Annual Conference selected by the retired ministers, and two superintendents named by the Bishop. The Chairperson of the Committee on Nominations shall be elected by the Annual Conference. A nominee shall be presented by the Committee on Nominations for consideration at the beginning of each quadrennium. The Conference Committee on Nominations shall elect additional officers at its first regular meeting in the new quadrennium. The following shall be ex-officio members without vote: the chairperson of the Committee on Standing Rules, the chairperson of the Conference Council on Connectional Ministries, the chairperson of the Commission on the Status and Role of Women, the chairperson of the Commission on Religion and Race, and the chairperson of the Conference Missional Priority Coordinating Committee.
 - a. It is recommended that there be one (1) lay person nominated and elected by each District Board of the Laity of each of the twelve (12) districts. Where there is no District Board of the Laity, the one (1) lay person shall be nominated and elected by the church lay leaders of that district.
 - b. It is recommended that there be one (1) clergy person nominated and elected from each district by the ministers of each of the twelve (12) districts.
 - c. These nominations, both lay and clergy, shall be elected by secret ballot in each district after at least three (3) persons shall have been nominated from the floor of each of the electing bodies. Election shall be by simple majority.
 - d. If a member of the Committee on Nominations, who has been nominated by the District moves beyond the boundaries of the District in which he/she was nominated, his/her membership on the Committee shall be terminated, except for the chairperson, vice-chairperson, and secretary, who should continue to serve as members-at-large on the Conference Committee on Nominations until the end of the quadrennium.
 - e. When district vacancies occur on the Committee, replacements shall be nominated as per rule 74.c to serve the remainder of the quadrennium. In the event that the elected chairperson of the Nominating Committee is one of the two elected representatives of a district, that chairperson shall become an additional member-at-large and the respective district shall elect another representative for that district, both of whom shall serve until the end of the quadrennium.
 - f. Current members of the Committee on Nominations shall not be nominated for membership on any board, council, commission or committee whose membership arises from nominations from this committee.
 - g. Ex-officio members of the Nominating Committee shall be excluded from rule 74.f.
 - h. The Committee shall make all nominations needed by the Annual Conference except as provided elsewhere by the *Discipline* or Standing Rules of the Annual Conference. When the *Discipline* or Standing Rules require nominations be made by other agencies of the Annual Conference, those nominations shall be reported to the Committee no later than March 15 of each year for information only. These nominations will not be submitted to the Annual Conference through the Committee on Nominations.
 - i. Nominations of chairpersons of all quadrennial boards, councils, commissions and committees, whose election is not prescribed by the *Discipline* or other sections of these Standing Rules shall be a nominated member of that board, council, commission or committee and shall be submitted by the Committee on Nominations to the Annual Conference for election.
 - j. When nominations are made, the persons nominated shall be consulted and their consent to serve

- received; whether nominated by parent boards, the Committee on Nominations or from the floor of the Annual Conference. 1
- k. The Annual Conference Committee on Nominations shall make nominations so that approximately one half (1/2) of the membership of all boards, councils, commissions and committees shall be rotated each quadrennium. 2
- l. The report of the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations shall include the full name, current mailing address and phone number(s) of each nominee. When a nomination is to a Board of Trust, the report shall identify any nominee who is a not a member of The United Methodist Church by indicating the denominational or religious affiliation of the person being nominated in parentheses following his or her name. 3-9
- m. It is recommended that the Nominating Committee nominate at least 25% ethnic minority representation to all Conference Boards and Agencies where such nominees originate with the Conference Committee on Nominations. When vacancies are filled and nominations from the floor are offered it is recommended that at least 25% ethnic minority membership be maintained. It is also recommended that until this representation is achieved, if from one to four members are to be elected, at least one be an ethnic minority; if five to eight are to be elected, at least two be ethnic minority persons. 10-16
- n. Unless otherwise provided in the *Book of Discipline*, a vacancy in the membership of a board, council, commission or committee may be filled, ad-interim, by the board, council, commission or committee for the remainder of the Conference year in which the vacancy occurs. At its next session the Annual Conference shall fill the vacancy for the remainder of the unexpired term. The respective board, council, commission or committee shall inform the Committee on Nominations of the vacancy and its action. 17-22

Rationale 1: To make sure that the Conference Lay Leader will always have representation. 23

Rationale 2: To clearly indicate the denominational or religious affiliation of the person being nominated so that the body has full disclosure of the affiliation of persons being elected to positions of leadership in our annual conference. 24-27

Standing Rule 72 will be amended by addition as follows: 28-29

72. There shall be a Committee on Standing Rules composed of nine (9) members nominated by the Annual Conference Committee on Nominations and elected by the Annual Conference. It is recommended that six (6) be lay persons and three (3) be clergy persons. The following shall be ex-officio members with vote: the President of the Conference United Methodist Women, the President of the Conference United Methodist Men, the President of the Conference Council on Youth Ministry, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Lay Leader or their designee, the chairperson of the Conference Council on Connectional Ministries, at least one district superintendent and the Conference Parliamentarian. 30-37

Rationale: To make sure that the Conference Lay Leader will always have representation. 38-39

**SOUTH CAROLINA CONFERENCE
BOARD OF PENSION AND HEALTH BENEFITS
2015 COMPREHENSIVE BENEFIT FUNDING PLAN SUMMARY**

The 2012 *Book of Discipline* ¶ 1506.6 requires that each annual conference develop, adopt and implement a formal comprehensive funding plan for funding all of its benefit obligations. The funding plan shall be submitted annually to the General Board of Pension and Health benefits for review and be approved annually by the annual conference, following the receipt and inclusion of a favorable written opinion from the General Board of Pension and Health Benefits (GBOPHB). This summary document is only a portion of the information contained in the actual signed funding plan. As such, it might not contain all the information required for a comprehensive view of the benefit obligations of the conference. You may request the full contents of the 2015 comprehensive benefit funding plan from your conference benefit office. 40-53

Following is the summary of the Comprehensive Benefit Funding Plan (CBFP) that received a favorable written opinion from GBOPHB for the 2015 conference benefit obligations: 54-56

Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP) Defined Benefit (DB) and Defined Contribution (DC) 57

Plan Overview: The Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP) is an Internal Revenue Code section 403(b) retirement program providing lifetime income and account flexibility designed for those who serve as clergy of The United Methodist Church. The plan is designed to provide participants with one portion of their overall retirement portfolio. CRSP replaced the Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP) effective January 1, 2007, which replaced the Pre-82 for service rendered prior to January 1, 1982. 58-63

1 CRSP consists of both a defined benefit (DB) plan, which provides a monthly benefit at retirement based
2 upon years of credited service to the Church, and a defined contribution (DC) plan, which provides a retirement
3 account balance established and funded by annual conferences. The Clergy Retirement Security Program
4 (CRSP-DB) annuities total liability as of January 1, 2013 is \$923.7 million, while total plan assets are \$978.5
5 million resulting in a current plan funded ratio of 106%. The South Carolina Conference portion of the liability is
6 2.87% and the 2015 contribution is \$2,827,665. The conference anticipates that the amount will be funded by:
7 Direct Billing. Additionally, General Conference 2012 approved a change to CRSP that provides each annual
8 conference the discretion to determine whether to cover three-quarter and/or half-time clergy. The South Carolina
9 Annual Conference has elected to cover clergy serving 100% under CRSP effective January 1, 2015.

10 Effective January 1, 2014 CRSP-DC plan was reduced from a 3% to a 2% of plan compensation non-
11 matching contribution. Clergy will have the opportunity to earn up to an additional 1% CRSP DC contribution by
12 contributing at least 1% of their plan compensation to UMPIP, therefore if a participant contributes at least 1% of
13 plan compensation to UMPIP, the individual will receive a contribution of 3%, which is unchanged from 2013 and
14 prior. The 2013 CRSP-DC contribution was \$1,226,000 and was funded by: Direct Billed to local churches. It is
15 anticipated that increases for future years will average 1.32%, due to: % change in CAC.

17 Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP)

18 **Plan Overview:** The Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP) provides clergy with a pension for their years of ministry
19 with The United Methodist Church from 1982 through 2006. MPP is an Internal Revenue Code section 403(b)
20 retirement plan. Effective January 1, 2014, exactly 65% of the account balance must be annuitized when it is to
21 be distributed. The remainder may be rolled over to UMPIP, another qualified plan or IRA, or paid in a lump sum.

22 The Ministerial Pension Plan (MPP) annuities total liability as of January 1, 2013 is \$2.7 billion, while total
23 plan assets are \$3.0 billion resulting in a current plan funded ratio of 109% and no required contribution for 2015.
24 The South Carolina Conference's portion of the total liability is 2.67%. Future MPP annuitants have a total account
25 balance of \$4.4 billion and the South Carolina Conference's portion of that balance is \$111.74 million or 2.55% of
26 the total.

28 Pre-1982 Plan

29 **Plan Overview:** Supplement One to the Clergy Retirement Security Program (CRSP), also known as the
30 Pre-82 Plan, provides clergy with a pension for their years of ministry with The United Methodist Church prior to
31 1982. The Pre-82 Plan was replaced by MPP effective January 1, 1982. When participants enter a Retired relation-
32 ship with your Conference, and does not terminate, the minimum benefit payable to them is based on two factors:
33 1) years of Service with pension credit and 2) Conference pension rate. Years of Service with pension credit are
34 approved by each Conference on the recommendation of the Conference Board of Pensions in accordance with
35 plan provisions and *The Book of Discipline*. The pension rate, also called the past service rate (PSR), is the dollar
36 amount chosen by the Conference as the amount payable for each approved year of Service with pension credit.
37 Typically, the pension rate changes from year to year. The number of years of Service with pension credit is multi-
38 plied by the PSR, and the product is the minimum annual benefit payable to those eligible for Pre-82 Plan benefits.
39 In certain situations the benefit received from the Pre-82 plan, may vary based on the applicability of what is
40 referred to as Defined Benefit Service Money (DBSM), which is the defined contribution feature of the Pre-1982
41 Plan. At the time that a participant retires, the DBSM account is converted to a life based benefit. At that point the
42 participants benefit is the greater of the PSR benefit or DBSM benefit. As the conference increases the PSR, the
43 participants benefit is recalculated; however the DBSM based benefit does not change.

44 The 2015 Past Service Rate (PSR) recommended to the South Carolina Annual Conference will be \$735.00,
45 which represents a 2.08% increase from the 2014 rate. The conference expects future increases to be approximately
46 2.00%, which is based on: Goal is to increase by 2% per year.

47 The contingent annuitant percentage is recommended to (remain/increase/decrease) at the 75% level.

48 Based on the final actuarial valuations from the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits as of January
49 1, 2013 for 2015, the portion of the Pre-82 liability attributable to the South Carolina Conference and funded
50 status is, as of 1/1/2013, as follows:

51	Funding Plan Liability	\$64,667,019	
52	Assets in the Plan	\$84,050,038	
53	Funded status	\$19,383,019	represented by a 130% funded ratio
54	Funded Status as of 12/31/2014	\$22,191,618	

55 The funded ratio is recalculated each year based on economic and demographic changes. This changes
56 create the possibility that Pre-82 contributions may be required at a future date (even after 2021).

57 Defined benefit plan liabilities (Pre-82, MPP and CRSP-DB) continue until the last benefit is paid to partici-
58 pants and their surviving spouses irrespective of the funding level of the plan. That is, even if the assets in the
59 plan are larger than the liabilities in the plan, the conference still has a liability (obligation) with the plan.

61 Active Health Benefit Program

62 **Plan Overview:** The South Carolina Conference offers a Self-Insured program to the active participants.

During the 2013 year, the total cost of the program was \$7,805,460 and was funded by Direct Billed to local churches and participants. The projected average increase for future years is expected to be 6%, due to: From Healthflex Actuary.

Post-Retirement Medical Benefit Program (PRM)

Plan Overview: The South Carolina Conference post-retiree medical plan currently offered is a Stipend plan made available to Defined Contribution of \$200 per month for all current retirees and covered spouses and retirees and Spouses retiring prior to 01/01/2016. All eligible retirees and covered spouses retiring on or after 01/01/2016 will receive \$100 a month per covered person.

The current annual cost is anticipated to be \$1,603,000 with the funding sources to be: Apportionments. On a longer term basis the South Carolina Conference intends to Fund through apportionments. Based on the most recent PRM valuation dated 12/31/2012, following is the funded position of the post-retiree medical benefits:

Accumulated Post Retirement Obligation (APBO) or net conference cost	\$23,485,383
Expected Post Retirement Obligation (EPBO) or net conference cost	\$23,735,198
Service Cost (SC) or net conference cost	\$202,100
Assets designated for PRM	\$7,632,610

These values are based on 3.50% long term discount rate, 0.00% long-term expected return, and a current increase trend of 8.00% decreasing to 5.00% by 2019.

Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP)

Plan Overview: The Comprehensive Protection Plan (CPP) provides death, long-term disability and other welfare benefits for eligible clergy of The United Methodist Church and their families and is an Internal Revenue Code 414(e) "church plan" funded by plan sponsor insurance premiums. Generally, you are eligible to participate in CPP if your conference or salary-paying unit sponsors the plan and you satisfy the eligibility requirements which include full-time episcopal appointment and plan compensation equal to or greater than 60% of the Denominational Average Compensation or the Conference Average Compensation whichever is less. The South Carolina Annual Conference has elected to make CPP-eligible clergy, who are appointed at least 100%, have mandatory participation, while 75% appointed clergy have optional participation under special arrangements.

Currently (for 2013) the South Carolina Conference has a required contribution to the Comprehensive Protection Plan of \$1,123,764, which is anticipated to be funded by Direct Billing to local churches. The anticipated average increase in future years is expected to be 1.32% per year due to: Change in the Conference Average Compensation.

United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) for Lay and Clergy

Plan Overview: The United Methodist Personal Investment Plan (UMPIP) is an Internal Revenue Code section 403(b) defined contribution retirement savings plan for clergy and lay employees of The United Methodist Church and affiliated organizations. Participants may make before-tax and/or after-tax contributions through payroll deductions. Participant contribution: Plan sponsor may make on the participants behalf and investment earnings comprise the individual's retirement account balance.

Conference office lay employees working an average of 30 hours per week or more are eligible after 0 months for a pension contribution of 9% of salary. Lay employees are encouraged to contribute personal funds toward their retirement through payroll deductions to the UMPIP. The estimated contribution for the South Carolina Conference is anticipated to be \$91,105 and funded through the Apportionments

As of January 1, 2014, the South Carolina Conference is sponsoring UMPIP for clergy serving less than full-time and are eligible for a pension contribution of 9% of salary. The estimated contribution for the South Carolina Conference is anticipated to be \$419,401 and funded through the Direct Billed to local churches.

Other Conference Defined Contribution Type Obligations

Plan Overview: The South Carolina Conference currently offers a Conference Lay Employee Death and Disability (UMLife) made available to lay conference employees. The contribution for 2013 was \$16,375 with the funding sources to be: Apportioned to local churches. The anticipated average increase in future years is expected to be 2.00% per year due to: No Salary Increase are Budgeted. Any increase would be due to the aging of insureds.

Plan Overview: The South Carolina Conference currently offers a Death Benefits for Pre BPP Conference Lay Employees. made available to three retired laay employees. The contribution for 2013 was \$216 with the funding sources to be: Apportionment. The anticipated average increase in future years is expected to be 5.00% per year due to: Historical avg increase.

Other Conference Defined Benefit Type Obligations

Plan Overview: The South Carolina Conference currently offers a DB Special Grant to Dependents and other special grants made available to clergy. The current liability is anticipated to be \$203 with the funding

1 sources to be until the death of recipient of special grant of \$16.88 per month. The contribution for 2014 is
2 anticipated to be \$203. The anticipated average increase in future years is expected to be .00% per year due to:
3 Negotiated settlement on special grant and dependent decease November 2012.

6 The 2015 Comprehensive Benefit Funding Plan and the above outlined Summary document incorporates to
7 the best of our understanding , the South Carolina Conference's obligations and funding requirements of the
8 benefits provided to the Clergy and Laity of the South Carolina Conference.

27 **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

28
29 ***Highlights***

30 The South Carolina Annual Conference of The United Methodist Church transitioned to a plan of direct
31 billing to local congregations in 2004 and 2005. As other Annual Conferences within the connection, the purpose
32 was to ask each church to provide full responsibility for their pastor(s)'s pension and health insurance benefits.

33 In 2006, an apportionment was added to provide for Retiree Health and Pension benefits and more efficiently
34 distribute this expense to local churches. As of April 1, 2014 nearly 40 churches would qualify to enter into this
35 voluntary forgiveness plan.

36
37 **Participation is completely voluntary based on the decision of the local congregation, pastor, District**
38 **Superintendent and Charge Conference.**

39
40 ***Objective***

41 To provide both relief and accountability to local churches who have been impacted by the economic turndown
42 and the inability to maintain regular payments due to the aging and weakened financial resources of congregational
43 membership. This forgiveness plan will provide the Annual Conference with additional future funding for Health
44 Benefits and Pension.

45 Since the establishment of direct billing, arrearages have been covered by the financial returns from funds
46 invested with the General Board of Pensions and Health Benefits.

47 This is not a sound procedure for the long term growth, viability and ministry of all churches and the SC Annual
48 Conference. Imagine how these additional funds can be used to care for the active and retired clergy and their
49 families. These clergy have and will serve the local churches of South Carolina to provide ministry and outreach
50 of the Gospel.

51
52 ***Keys to Effective Accomplishment of Plan***

53 The members of the South Carolina Conference Cabinet and the staff of the Administrative Services Office
54 have been very faithful and attentive to assisting churches in understanding of and returning to regular payments
55 of this item. It is a goal of the Resident Bishop, the Council on Finance and Administration and the Conference
56 Treasurer that a specified strategy needs to be adopted to both offer to and encourage local churches to returning
57 to responsible payment of the direct billing costs.

58
59 ***Rationale for Plan***

60 When the Direct Bill Plan was approved it was hoped that all churches could participate at the full payment
61 level. Unfortunately, due to a variety of factors some congregations became behind in making regular payments
62 toward the pension/retirement and health care/insurance expenses of their appointed clergy.

Below is the history of total balances due from local churches in the South Carolina Annual Conference since 2008....

In order to cover these outstanding unpaid balances pension and health insurance funds which have been placed and deposited with the General Board of Pensions have been applied/used. Below is a history of earnings on the funds (both realized and unrealized).....

Using these earnings to pay for congregations unable to pay is acceptable for the short term. However, for the long term this is not a good use or stewardship of these funds. It is not a sustainable model for the long term financial health of our local congregations or the Annual Conference.

In Luke’s Gospel chapter ten, we hear these words about properly caring for God’s money....” *Whoever is faithful in a very little is faithful also in much; and whoever is dishonest in a very little is dishonest also in much. ¹¹If then you have not been faithful with the dishonest wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? ¹²And if you have not been faithful with what belongs to another, who will give you what is your own?”* (Luke 16:10-12, *New Revised Standard Version*)

As congregational leaders, we are entrusted with the resources which God has provided. We are to use these gifts properly, efficiently and responsibly. Attending to these past obligations shows responsible and faithful stewardship.

PLAN DETAILS

Guidelines for Participation

Local Churches and/or Charges which desire to participate in this forgiveness plan must:

1. Have total direct billing arrearage balances of \$ 25,000 or more over any period of years.
2. One quarter of the direct billing arrearage balance will be forgiven completely.
3. Agree to make an initial payment of 10 percent of balance to the Administrative Services Office. Balances due will be determined at the date of the application.
4. Agree to make monthly payments via checking account draft.
5. Monthly payment amounts will be calculated at a maximum term of 60 months. Congregations with debts which exceed \$ 50,000 may *request* a term of 72 months.
6. No interest will be charged.
7. No additional debt whatsoever will be incurred by any local church participating in the Forgiveness Plan without permission of the District Superintendent.
8. It is clearly expected that participating congregations maintain regular, faithful monthly draft payments.
9. The Forgiveness Agreement Plan must be approved by the local congregation Church Council, Charge Conference and the appointed pastor. The signatures of the Church Council Chair, Local Church Lay Leader, Chair of Board of Trustees, Charge Conference Recording Secretary and the pastor must be submitted on the Agreement Plan application and final document.
10. The Forgiveness Agreement Plan application must be completed and submitted to the District Superintendent of the local congregation who will review, approve and sign the plan. Forms then are forwarded to the Administrative Services Office for verification and notarization. A final document explaining the exact agreed upon details and repayment terms will then be issued to the local congregation with a copy sent to the District Superintendent. Notary approval is also required for the final document.
11. All completed agreements will be reported in summary format to the Council on Finance and Administration, the Board of Pensions and Health Benefits, the Resident Bishop and the Cabinet.

1 **Supervision**

2 This plan will be administered, supervised and managed by the Administrative Services/Conference Treasurer's
3 Office with regular consultation with the Council on Finance and Administration. All funds received from the
4 Forgiveness Plan will return directly to the local church's direct billing obligation and to no other funds of the
5 Annual or General Conferences.

6

7 **Start-Up Summary**

8 This plan has been approved by the Council on Finance and Administration on March 17, 2014 and by the South
9 Carolina Annual Conference on June 4, 2014 (PENDING APPROVAL) meeting in session in Florence, South
10 Carolina. It shall be implemented beginning October 1, 2014 as pilot program via application to the Conference
11 Treasurer and District Superintendent. The full plan will begin on February 1, 2015 for any and all eligible
12 congregations.

13

14 **Communication of Plan**

15 Both members of the Cabinet and the Administrative Services Office shall offer this plan to any and all local
16 churches. CF&A and the Board of Pensions and Health Benefits shall be charged with encouraging all eligible
17 congregations to participate. An article shall be submitted to the *South Carolina United Methodist Advocate*
18 about the plan, an article will be posted on the South Carolina Annual Conference website and a mailing will be
19 sent to all eligible congregations describing the plan and its benefits. Clergy will be briefed on the Forgiveness
20 Plan at District Clergy gatherings/Set Up meetings in August or September 2014. Laity will be oriented on the
21 plan at the earliest District-wide gathering possible.

3 The South Carolina Annual Conference continues to be blessed with a vivacious camping and retreat ministry.
4 It is a joy to work together with you to fulfill our mission statement of "Serving all people for Christian birth,
5 growth, and renewal."

6 Asbury Hills has continues to grow its summer camp and groups conference ministry, and we believe the
7 strong programing, the strong staff leadership, and continued improvement in facilities have really made the
8 difference.

9 We continue to measure specific outcomes at Asbury Hills as a way of strengthening child and spiritual
10 development. Here are a few of your 2013 responses:

- 11 - 98.8% stated that they now have a closer relationship with God.
- 12 - 95.7% said that they now feel more confident in themselves.
- 13 - 96.7% tried something new.
- 14 - 95.7% said they can use what they learned at camp and apply it at home.

15 Asbury Hills had the largest Fall Festival ever, giving away lots of apple butter. Our social media sites continue
16 to grow, so if you are not part of the action, then we encourage you to log on and take part. We had a very
17 successful day camp at Rock Hill, with plans to continue in 2014. A new low ropes course was added, and the
18 overall evaluations from summer camp came back with great reviews!

19 About six years ago, monies was put aside in hopes that someday we would be able to purchase the remaining
20 10 acres of the Sky Ranch property at Asbury. And now, hope no more, Sky Ranch is no longer divided, and we
21 look forward to future programming on the new site.

22 We are excited to announce Jean Fisher, our new part-time Accounts Payable/Receivable clerk. Jean has
23 been a wonderful asset to our ministry and we are still in awe of how we ever made it without her. And Sarah
24 Kelley has changed positions from Business Services Director to Events & Marketing Director, thus pulling our
25 marketing in-house and allowing us to increase our exposure.

26 And to top things off, we held our first successful Camps & Retreat Ministries Golf Tournament the day
27 before Annual Conference in Florence, SC, with the Florence District taking home the traveling trophy. Who will
28 it be in 2014?

29 In December of 2013 the Camps & Retreat Office was moved from just off Woodruff Road to just off Pleasantburg
30 Drive in Greenville.

31 Our Board continues to assess the demand for and feasibility of future development of Sewee Coastal
32 Retreat Center as an adult retreat center. After meetings with the Bishop and Cabinet early this year, the board
33 is facing the monumental task on how to accommodate large UMC groups such as United Methodist Women's

The primary purpose of the Board of Ordained Ministry continues to be the recruitment, examination, and credentialing of candidates for commissioned and ordained ministry. District committees on ministry extend the work of the conference board by guiding persons in the candidacy process and reviewing the progress and work of clergy called to licensed ministry.

2013 has been a very active and productive year for the Board of Ordained Ministry. The conference board interviewed 45 candidates seeking commissioning or full conference membership while our district committees on ministry have met with hundreds of candidates who are seeking certification as candidates for ministry in the United Methodist church or who are serving as supply, part-time, or full-time local pastors.

Because of faithfulness and generosity of local churches paying apportionments in 2013, the board has been able to assist no fewer than 80 persons at eight different university senate-approved seminaries with the cost of funding their theological education in the amount \$177,675! We further rejoice that the recipients of these resources are local pastors and seminarians. We have been able to offer these resources through the Ministerial Education Fund.

Additionally, we have full-time students who are recipients of scholarship from the Board of Ordained Ministry. These recipients are:

We are pleased to recommend 23 candidates for provisional membership and commissioning, and 15 candidates for full membership and ordination. These persons have been nurtured through the candidacy process and have shown themselves ready and effective for a life of licensed, commissioned, and ordained ministry. We will celebrate with these persons tonight as they are commissioned and ordained for the work of ministry in Christ holy church.

Beginning in July, we begin a new candidacy group mentoring process. Our goal is help candidates navigate the candidacy process with ease while building authentic and enduring covenant relationships with one another. As we live into this new process, we will continue to use individual mentors with our local pastors and with those who are currently certified, but are not under appointment. Candidacy retreats will be held annually in January and July. The retreats are intended to be a time for candidates to learn together what ordained/licensed ministry looks like in the United Methodist Church and the South Carolina Conference, and to discern how God is calling them to serve. To date there are already 50 persons signed up to attend our first retreat in July.

As part of their requirements for ordination, provisional clergy members are to present a project "that demonstrates fruitfulness in carrying out the church's mission of 'making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world'" (see ¶¶ 330.4 and 335 in *The United Methodist Book of Discipline*). Those seeking ordination in 2015 will be the first class to present the fruitfulness projects. These projects will be evaluated as a part of the work submitted to Called and Disciplined Life Committee.

We celebrate the journey of persons called to serve the church through the process of licensed ministry at this particular moment in their journey. Today, we recognized those persons who have participated in the 2014 School of Pastoral Ministry and now offer themselves for service in Christ holy church as first time licensed local pastors. At this time, I would ask those persons, along with the Bishop Holston, our conference Lay Leader, Barbara Ware, and our District Lay Leaders to gather here at the stage. As these persons come, allow me to recognize several categories of person who have reached important milestones in their journey.

Having completed the five years **Basic Course of Study in 2013** are the following persons: Wanda Altman, Willie Cannon, Mike Catoe, Curtis Felkel, Larry McCray, Phillip Reynolds and Muriel Scott.

WHEREAS, The Church Conference of St. John United Methodist Church, Stage Coach Road, Garnett, South Carolina, voted to discontinue St. John United Methodist Church and

WHEREAS, The District Board of Church and Location and Building, Walterboro District, in session December 31, 2013, consented that St. John United Methodist Church be discontinued; and

WHEREAS, The Bishop, The South Carolina Conference of the United Methodist Church, and a majority of the District Superintendents thereof, have consented to the discontinuance of St. John United Methodist Church; and

WHEREAS, all of the former members of St. John United Methodist Church have transferred to other churches or have withdrawn;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the South Carolina Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church, in session June 1-4, 2014, in Florence, South Carolina, does hereby declare St. John United Methodist Church, Stage Coach Road, Garnett, South Carolina discontinued; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the South Carolina Conference expresses thanksgiving to God for the Christian ministry rendered across the years by the members and pastors of St. John United Methodist Church; and be it further

Resolved, That the District Superintendent of the Walterboro District shall have the authority to authorize the disposition of the tangible personal property items belonging to St. John United Methodist Church; and be it further

Resolved, That the real property and remaining personal property of St. John United Methodist Church (not including those tangible personal items authorized for disposition by the District Superintendent) including the monies of St. John United Methodist Church held in bank accounts or otherwise, shall be conveyed and transferred to the South Carolina Conference to be held in trust by Board of Trustees of the South Carolina Conference, and be it further

Resolved, That the Board of Trustees of the South Carolina Conference is authorized to use the monies transferred by St. John United Methodist Church for the care and maintenance of the property until the further disposition of the property; and be it further

The Hinton Center, a year round Christian mission and retreat center, is located on breathe-taking Lake Chatuge on the North Carolina-Georgia line. The retreat has a wide range of accommodations including houses with lake views, the mountain lodge, cottages, group retreat houses, and RV sites. In addition to the accommodations, Hinton hospitality includes an Executive Chef with mouth-watering meals, often straight from the garden,

throughout your stay. Whether you're looking for overnight accommodations for private retreat and renewal or seeking facilities for a church group, Hinton is sure to have something for you. Our retreat includes multiple conference rooms, a serene setting for weddings and receptions, a gift shop, dining rooms, trails, complimentary wi-fi service, a lake-side pavilion with dock, indoor and outdoor chapels, and a rocking chair porch overlooking beautiful Lake Chatuge!

Perhaps the best thing about staying at Hinton is your opportunity to pay it forward. The revenue generated through Hinton Center accommodations helps to fund home repairs, ministries to end generational poverty, and programming that focuses on building healthy and effective communities of faith. Our core ministries include Rural and Small Membership Church Vitality, Year-Round Volunteer Missions, Affordable Housing, and Conference and Retreat Center.

For many years, through Rural and Small Membership Church Consultation, Hinton has held a reputation for leading many churches through visioning and planning sessions leading to new life in the church. Our new vitality ministry continues to build on our history of success. With financial support from The Duke Endowment, we are working with district superintendents and districts throughout the SEJ in their role as missional strategist and with small and rural congregations. We facilitate a process of learning, discernment, and planning for transformational ministry and congregational vitality. Each initiative is customized for the unique needs of the district or church. Ministry consultants guide each congregation and/or district through the process and provide follow-up for at least a year to insure ongoing success.

Year-Round Volunteer Missions, referred to as the "Cadillac of mission experiences," by Rev. Brad Thie of Duke's Thriving Rural Communities Initiative, includes the repair work, times for spiritual formation and reflection, soft beds, beautiful surroundings, and awesome food! The price for the week-long experience has been reduced to be more in-line with other mission experiences and individualized trips can be designed upon request. Our 2014 summer slots were nearly 100% booked by December of 2013. This spring, we hosted our first interfaith mission experience as well as alternative spring breaks for college students. Hinton hosts over 1,000 volunteers each year with weeks specifically for youth and other weeks for of all ages in mission together. We offered 83 worship services for our summer volunteers alone. Whether working on a home or in our firewood ministry, volunteers are helping to meet the needs of this rural community where 1/5 of the population lives below the poverty line.

As our ministries continue to strengthen, so does our financial position. This strength was evidenced in 2013, as we entered into the black. Hosting nearly 17,000 overnight stays, we have a 24% increase in lodging and continue to grow our volunteer mission ministry into a year-round experience with over 1300 registered for 2014 summer alone. With assistance from the SEJ and donations through our Capital Campaign, we are working on paying down our debt. Furthermore, we are addressing much needed upgrades to our facility, vehicles, and tools. In our Capital Campaign, we are over half-way to our minimum goal of \$150,000 and have aspirations to reach our celebration goal of \$400,000. Upgrading our facilities, providing fresh, healthy meals, and increasing our marketing will help Hinton become more financially secure, ultimately, providing Hinton with the opportunity to expand its ministries and sharing the Love of Christ.
