On October 2-4, 2014 clergy and laity from across the state of SC and beyond will gather at the DoubleTree by Hilton, in Columbia, SC for a conference on strengthening the ministry of African American congregations in the SC Annual Conference. The 2014 Summit will focus on Ministry With the Poor. What is poverty? What causes it and how does it affect people? How are we called to respond? We will explore the responses to these and other complex questions.

This summit is being held to train, strengthen, and equip our local congregations to be in ministry with the poor. We must listen and learn to be in ministry and relationship with others. Then together, we can seek to change conditions that are unjust, alienating, and disempowering.

The 2014 registration is being done on line. You may register at http:// www.umcsc.org. Click on the logo for the Summit where you will find all the material needed to register for the event, make hotel reservations, or purchase ads for the souvenir worship booklet. The registration cost includes the cost of the ticket for the banquet on Friday night. Each person will need to make his or her own hotel reservations directly with the DoubleTree by Hilton at (803) 731-0300. You will need to make your reservation by September 8th 2014 to be in the block of rooms.

In our time together, we will be led in worship and learning by powerful and anointed leaders from across the United Methodist Church. Our praise and worship will be led by Jarvis Wilson and Robert McMichael of Atlanta, Georgia. This dynamic duo led worship at the 2012 Summit on the Black Church. Additionally, we will learn from other dynamic and effective leaders from across the SC Annual Conference who will lead workshops that will enable local congregations to address root causes of poverty in their community.

Each workshop is designed to address pragmatic and practical applications of ministry in the local church. Participants will leave the summit with some new ideas, skills, and strategies.

Our Keynote Speaker

Bishop Gregory Vaughn Palmer was assigned as episcopal leader of the Illinois Area of The United Methodist Church Sept. 1, 2008.

Born and raised in Philadelphia, Pa., Bishop Palmer is a "child of the church," the son of the Rev. Herbert E. and Mrs. Charlotte Sue Hewitt Palmer. Bishop Palmer's father is a retired United Methodist pastor; his mother (now deceased) was a school teacher in the Philadelphia Public School system. Rev. Herbert Palmer and his wife Peggy reside in Philadelphia.

Bishop Palmer received his undergraduate degree from George Washington University in Washington, D.C. and his master's of divinity degree from Duke

Divinity School, Durham, N.C. Baldwin-Wallace College, Iowa Wesleyan College and Simpson College have all awarded him honorary degrees.

Ordained a deacon and probationary member in the Eastern Pennsylvania Conference in 1977, Palmer was ordained an elder in full connection in the East Ohio Conference in 1981.

His pastoral career includes pastorates at Granville-Vance UMC's and Durham Asbury Temple UMC in North Carolina; East Glennville UMC and Werner UMC in Cleveland, Ohio; James S. Thomas UMC in Canton, Ohio and the United Methodist Church of Berea, Berea, Ohio. Palmer also served as district superintendent of the Youngstown District of the East Ohio Conference.

In 2000, Palmer was elected to the episcopacy by the North Central Jurisdictional Conference. He was assigned to the lowa Area where he served until assuming responsibilities in the Illinois Area. Bishop Palmer served as president of the General Board of Higher Education and Ministry from 2004 to 2008, and president of the Council of Bishops from April 2008 to May 2010.

Bishop Palmer and his wife of 34 years, Cynthia, are the parents of two grown children – Monica, a middle school special education teacher in the Charlotte, N.C. and Aaron, who is employed at Impact Technologies in Charlotte, N.C.
