

My name is Faye Love, your District Social Action Coordinator. I enjoyed meeting the Social Action coordinators that attended District Training. We reviewed the Conference 2013 Social Action Goals which are listed below:

- Encourage local units to select a member as the local unit Social Action Coordinator or contact person.
- Implement the Charter for Racial Justice, to increase awareness and understanding of true racial
 justice, by encouraging local units to become Racial Justice Diamond units (RJDU). Each District will
 increase 2013 recognized RJDU by 2%.
- Become informed, advocate and distribute information on at least one social action issue including but not limited to: domestic violence, environmental justice, human trafficking, immigration, health care, Children's Sabbath, racial inequality, juvenile justice, Sudan, Haiti, bullying or economic factors affecting women, children and youth.
- Support public schools with visibility and advocate for both quality public schools and adequate funding.
- Continue to inform UMW members and support efforts to pass greater consumer protection laws by contacting your state legislator.

There are many books on the United Methodist Women's Reading List as well as articles in the Response and New World Outlook Magazines that provide a great deal of information on these topics. Please take some time to read on these topics and discuss in your monthly meetings.

Henderson Settlement is a Methodist-affiliated organization whose purpose is to meet the basic needs of people in southeast Kentucky and northeast Tennessee. It is one of the four institutions of the Red Bird Missionary Conference and is located in the mountainous area of southern Kentucky. Lots of information and photos can be seen on their website (www.hendersonsettlement.com) or by searching Facebook for Henderson Settlement.

While there we will be working in the thrift shop, greenhouse and other areas at the main campus. We will be housed there and meals will be provided for us.

Travel will be by motor coach and our pick up points and times will be determined at a later date. She resided in New York City, NY from 1964 to 1976. Upon returning to North Carolina in 1976 she was employed by the Davidson County Sheriff's Department.

She received several degrees and in 1986 she was appointed as the first female pastor of Chestnut Grove United Methodist Church in Davidson County and Piney Grove United Methodist Church in Davie County where she served until 1992. She also received her Master of Divinity from Duke University Divinity School in 1992.

In July 2008 she became the pastor of St. Matthews United Methodist Church in Greensboro, NC; the first female pastor in the church's 142 year history.

Arnetta is the mother of two sons, Russell Beverly of Hedgesville, West Virginia and Ronald Beverly, Jr. of Lexington, NC. She has nine grandchildren, two great-grandchildren and makes her home in Greensboro with her grandson, Matt, a college student.

When you arrive at Lake Junaluska Confernce & Retreat Center (via I-40 take exit 27 onto US 19-23. Drive 3-4 miles. **Do not** take exit 104 – it is easy to get lost. Take exit 103 and drive about 1 mile until you see Lake Junaluska Conference Center front entrance on the right. As you turn in the Bethea Welcome Center is on your left and you will check-in for Lodging and Retreat Registration here. The Friday and Saturday sessions begin at 4:15 p.m. in the Harrell Center Auditorium.
