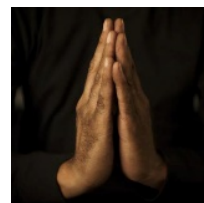




The Joseph Benjamin Bethea Distinguished Service Award

This non-monetary award is presented each year at Annual Conference to a person who has performed outstanding service in working for racial justice. Sponsored by the Religion and Race Committee of the Advocacy Area of Connectional Ministries of the South Carolina Conference of The United Methodist Church. Nominees must be a member (laity or clergy) of the S.C. Annual Conference and have demonstrated strong Christian social justice commitment for at least five years preceding the nomination (unless the individual is a youth) by specific efforts toward the elimination of racism; and/or the building of inclusiveness and/or empowerment of racial or ethnic minority persons. The nominee must model him/herself after the servanthood of Jesus and shall be a person of genuine Christian character who loves the church and is committed to the oneness of the body of Christ.
