

If you do not have a checking account, you should get one. Look for a bank that does not charge fees on this type of account and will accept the tax ID number of the United Methodist Women. We all have to use the same number. First Citizens and Greer State Bank have proven friendly to our units. Also, please remember that remittances should be made payable to **Greenville District UMW**, not to me personally. Contact me with any questions and to obtain copies of the tax ID information you need to open your checking account.

Did you know there are around 1500 children in need of foster care in the Upstate and only about 500 foster families? That means children are being place outside of their communities, in less than ideal situations, and even in group homes, due to lack of families. Having fostered 25 teen girls myself, I firmly believe fostering is a way for Christians to answer God's call to care for the fatherless. What a way to build the Kingdom, by pouring God's love into a child. Planting a seed which will not only stay in their hearts, but be passed on to their biological families, friends and communities as they return with God's love in their lives.

Foster care to me is so similar to the good news of the gospel of Christ Jesus. We were dead in our addictions, sins and bondage, without acceptance, without security and without significance. The good news is that Christ's sacrifice for us changed all of that as we were adopted into God's family. Transformed into a new creation, made alive in God and to God!

In our efforts to get the word out to Christians that foster parents are desperately needed, we are asking women's ministries to help us. We can come and speak at a meeting, to a Sunday school class or home group, hold an informational meeting, or host a table with information. Please let us know if you are interested in partnering with us in the effort to provide Christian families for children in need.

The Twin City Outreach Mission is proud to announce a historical moment in history. On June 19, 2012 a General bill was passed by the South Carolina House and Senate and signed into law by Governor Nikki Haley of South Carolina on June 26, 2012 for a special (Historic) license plate in the name of Dr. Mary McLeod Bethune, a native of Mayesville, SC, an American educator and civil rights leader best known for starting a school (Bethune-Cookman University) for African American students in Daytona Beach, Florida. Dr. Bethune was advisor to four United States Presidents and served as the First Black Cabinet Member on African American Affairs to President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Henderson Settlement is a Methodist-affiliated organization whose purpose is to meet the basic needs of people in southeast Kentucky and northeast Tennessee. It is one of the four institutions of the Red Bird Missionary Conference and is located in the mountainous area of southern Kentucky. While there we will be working in the thrift shop, greenhouse and other areas at the main campus. We will be housed there and meals will be provided for us.

Travel will be by motor coach and our pick up points and times will be determined at a later date. She also received her Master of Divinity from Duke University Divinity School in 1992.

In July 2008 she became the pastor of St. Matthews United Methodist Church in Greensboro, NC; the first female pastor in the church's 142 year history.

Arnetta is the mother of two sons, Russell Beverly of Hedgesville, West Virginia and Ronald Beverly, Jr. of Lexington, NC. She has nine grandchildren, two great-grandchildren and makes her home in Greensboro with her grandson, Matt, a college student.

Take exit 103 and drive about 1 mile until you see Lake Junaluska Conference Center front entrance on the right.
