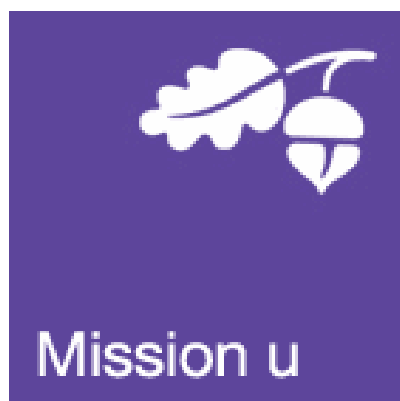

My Experience At Mission u

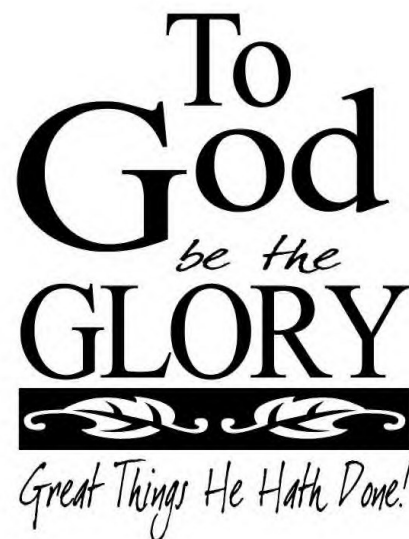
Dear Sisters In Christ,

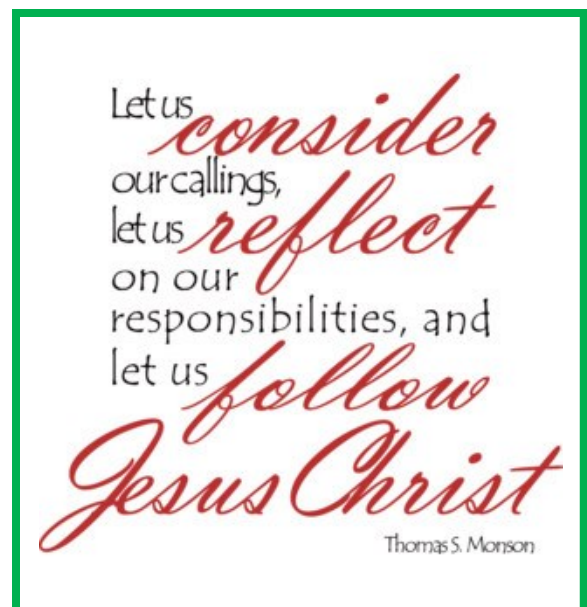

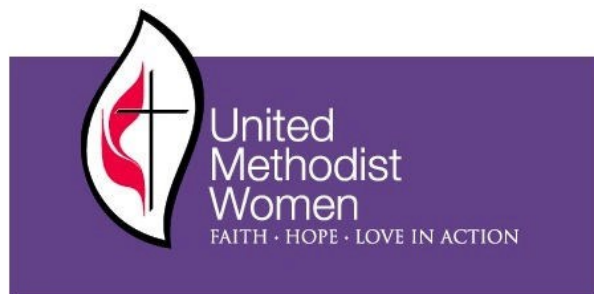

Gets New Purpose

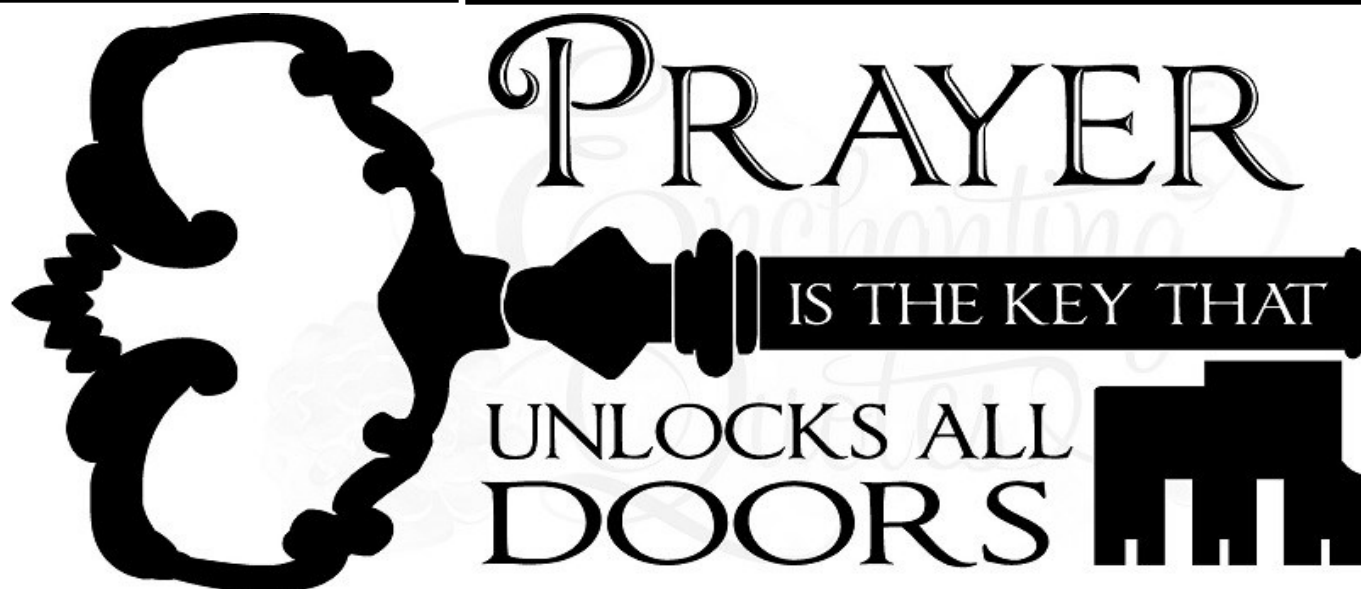
