Ukraine is part of the Moldova-Ukraine Conference of The United Methodist Church. The Ukraine UMC has created a crisis committee to oversee all the support that is coming in through the Advance #14053A "Eurasia In Mission Together - Ukraine and Moldova." https://www.ntmission.org/advance-project/14053a/

The money channeled through this Advance has already started to arrive in Ukraine and a crisis committee is making decisions as to how

these funds are being used. Weekly reports will be made to Ullas Tankler who is the Global Ministries representative for Europe, Eurasia and North Africa. This gives us confidence to work through the Advance directly with Ukraine. **Donors can designate their gift on this Advance.** Designation can be for general refugee relief or some other project.
