### LIVING STONES

4 Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and 5 like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. 6 For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." 7 To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," 8 and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. 9 But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. 10 Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.





## ERT WORK IN MISSISSIPPI

Rev. Mike Evans, the Greenwood District Disaster Response Coordinator, participated in the Flood Bucket Packing Event hosted by St. Mark and Tranquil UMCs on April 29. (see page 5) He was able to share pictures from the latest ERT trip to Mississippi to assist with post-tornado cleanup. One of the sites was basically an empty lot, the site of a church and parsonage. The only thing left was the steps leading to where the sanctuary had been. On another site the team met the family who had lost everything. The team prayed for that family because one of their twin sons perished in the storm. Since there were no homes left to protect in the area where the team was sent, they did a lot of care ministry—helping to rescue beloved photographs and other memorabilia; helping homeowners salvage what they could. The team even helped a woman find her purse that contained all the Social Security cards for her children.

Emergency Response Teams (ERTs) have made recent trips to Florida, Kentucky, Alabama, and Mississippi.
