- provide intergenerational story exchanges that promote developing relationship and empathy.







Where is your church?

Each church creates a team of clergy/laity committed to a year of work as a part of a cohort to set goals, implement and evaluate. Share with your Church Council.











Who Will Be on Your Team?

Apply for Cohort 2026: Steps:

- 1. Pastor, with staff and laity discuss with Church Council before applying for the 2026 Cohort.
- Select diverse team members.
 Choose your team leader.
- 3. Review the dates for training (Columbia may be the location).
- 4. Select 4 team members (the pastor will make it 5) that will commit to attend the trainings.
- 5. Attend an Online Q& A Session to learn more about the grant. (3 will be offered)



8. An interview will be scheduled online for your team (4 + Pastor)

In Summary...




This grant represents a strategic investment in uniting and revitalizing the United Methodist community through intergenerational worship, fostering belonging, and inclusivity for all members, especially children.
