Charters

We continue to struggle in South Carolina to get increases in Chartered Churches. We lost 113 Churches in June 2023 due to disaffiliation. We now have 57 Active Chartered churches for 2024. We have 122 charters that have lapsed. We will continue to reach out to those churches in the future.

EMS

We had a total of 13 active EMS members with 10 expired in 2023 and 35 lapsed. Most of our EMS comes from our Conference Leadership Team.

Prayer Ministry

We continue to promote the Upper Room Prayer Wall. We have had an increase in SC men connecting to Live Bold. We continue to provide a Prayer Room at our annual Men N Ministry Conference each year. As a part of that, we provide a prayer line number for individuals to call or text prayer needs or concerns. These were led by our Chaplain and Prayer Advocate.

Spiritual Retreat

The S.C. Methodist Men's Annual Conference was held at Journey Church, Columbia, SC on February 24, 2024.

The weekend began with the SC Men N Ministry Golf tournament Friday morning. The largest turnout to date, we had 43 Golfers hit the links at The Spur at Northwoods in Columbia.
