## Social Action Coordinator Report

Save the date, I look forward to seeing you in person at Legislative Advocacy Day which will be held at Epworth Children's Home on March 18, 2025. Our theme is **Faithful Advocacy**; **Faithful Service**; **Transforming Justice and Equity.** 

The program continues our national priority focus areas of Climate Justice and Ending Mass Incarceration and Criminalization of Communities of Color. Climate crisis is an injustice issue which disproportionally impacts those most vulnerable and marginalized in societies, as well as women and girls. Eighty percent of people displaced by climate change are women. Well over two million individuals are impacted by mass incarceration, and the school to prison pipeline disproportionately affects girls of color.

Programs such as Legislative Advocacy Day awaken and empower our UWF sisters to:

**Equip** – We equip women and girls around the world to be leaders.

**Organize**- We are connectional because together we can do more to make a difference in our lives, communities and world, especially for women, children and youth.

**Educate**- We provide educational information and experiences that lead to personal change that helps transform the world.

**Serve and Advocate**- We work for justice through compassionate service, and we advocate to change unfair policies.

Many organizations have been formed to combat injustice in our state, including:

The Faith & Justice Table is a coalition of faith leaders from across South Carolina who come together to encourage social advocacy on a variety of issues in our state. The mission of the SC Faith & Justice Table is to gather, equip and mobilize faith leaders to serve as prophetic voices in the public arena. This grassroots group specifically aims to connect with members of the SC General Assembly legislators because they know their need to hear from faith leaders in our community with a dedication to progress. This coalition addresses a wide range of policies related to civil liberties and the pursuit of justice. They are conducting an Advocacy 101 training at Washington Street UMC on January 6, 2025. More information about this training will follow later.

However, in the meantime, I encourage you to do the random acts of kindness that we may not think of as social action acts. By that I mean small ways to combat injustice or to reflect God's love to others and show them they are worthy. Open the door for someone loaded down. Send an unexpected card to uplift another's day. Take an extra plate to that shut-in you're visiting. But my favorite, give a great big old smile and a really tight hug to remind people of God's love!
