

Laity have long been a part of ministry in Methodism. Lay preachers, exhorters, and class leaders have served the church since its earliest days. The certified lay minister is "called and equipped to conduct public worship, care for the congregation, assist in program leadership, develop new and existing faith communities, preach the word, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson." (2016 BOD ¶268.1)



This guide is made for any United Methodist lay person who may be exploring Certified Lay Ministry in the South Carolina Conference. This is intended to be an introductory guide to the process. This guide includes some basic information related to both Lay Servant Ministry and Certified Lay Speaker Ministry due to their relationship to Certified Lay Servant Ministry. The United Methodist Church has established three categories for laypersons in the area of lay servant ministries to develop, prepare, and engage principled Christian leaders for the mission of making disciples for the transformation of the world: Certified Lay Servant, Certified Lay Speaker and Certified Lay Minister.

Certified Lay Servant

A certified lay servant serves the local church or charge (and/or beyond) and:

- provides program leadership, assistance, and support.
- leads meetings for prayer, training, study, and discussion.
- conducts, or assists in conducting, services of worship, preaches the Word, or gives addresses.
- provides congregational and community leadership and fosters caring ministries.
- assists in the distribution of the elements of Holy Communion.
- teaches the Scriptures, doctrine, organization, and ministries of The United Methodist Church.

Certified Lay Speaker

A certified lay speaker serves by preaching the Word when requested by the pastor, district superintendent, or committee on lay servant ministries in accordance and compliance with ¶341.1 of *The Book of Discipline*. The role of a certified lay speaker is a specific calling for the ministry of pulpit supply.

Certified Lay Minister

A certified lay minister serves as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson and:

- conducts public worship.
- cares for the congregation.
- develops new faith communities.
- preaches the Word.
- leads small groups.
- establishes outreach ministries.
- serves as a class leader.
- assists in program leadership.
- engages in specialized ministries after appropriate training such as in parish nursing, church planting, men's ministry, children's faith formation, congregational care, and more.

Becoming A Certified Lay Minister



A Certified Lay Minister (¶268) desires to further his/her calling to preach the word, provide a care ministry to the congregation, assist in program leadership and be a witness in the community for the growth and missional and connectional thrust of the United Methodist Church as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergy person. The Superintendent of a District assigns a Certified Lay Minister to a particular ministry within the South Carolina Annual Conference.

To become a Certified Lay Minister, you must complete the following requirements:

- Be a professing and active member of a local church/charge.
- Complete a Lay Servant Ministries Initial Application. The application will be submitted to your pastor and your church's Charge Conference for approval, and ultimately to the district Committee on Lay Servant Ministry for action.
 - o Written recommendation from District Superintendent (On application)
 - Written recommendation from Pastor (On application)
 - Vote of Charge Conference (On application)
- Complete Form F102 (Biographical Background Form)
- Complete Form 07SCBOM (Criminal Background Form)
- Complete a Course of Sexual Ethics
- Complete the Basic Course for Lay Servant Ministries.
- Complete the six required core Lay Speaker courses of study:
 - o Discovering Spiritual Gifts
 - Leading Worship
 - o Leading Prayer
 - o Called To Preach
 - o Living Our United Methodist Beliefs (Heritage)
 - Life Together in the United Methodist Connection (UM Polity)
- Complete four CLM modules:
 - o Call and Covenant for Ministry
 - The Practice of Ministry
 - o Organization for Ministry
 - o Connection for Ministry Discipleship Ministries
- Interview with the district Committee on Ordained Ministry and be recommended.
- Complete a Lay Servant Ministries <u>Request for Renewal Application</u> (back) every two years.
- Interview with the district Committee on Ordained Ministry and be recommended to the Conference Committee on Lay Servant Ministries for recertification every two years.
- Complete continuing education aligned with ministry assignment and update a mutual ministry plan

A certified lay minister is a certified lay servant, certified lay missioner, or equivalent as defined by his or her central conference, who is called and equipped to conduct public worship, care for the congregation, assist in program leadership, develop new and existing faith communities, preach the Word, lead small groups, or establish community outreach ministries as part of a ministry team with the supervision and support of a clergyperson. A certified lay minster is assigned by a district superintendent in accordance with \P 419.2.
