Greetings, Easter people! Hope you are looking forward to a wonderful summer.



Program Resources Carol Weatherford

(Reading Program)

Response Magazine is a very valuable resource for members and officers of United Women in Faith. It provides ideas for programs, devotionals, social action and spiritual growth. For exam-

ple, the Unit at Clemson United Methodist Church recently initiated a social action project to be completed in the fall that was inspired by an article in *Response Magazine* written by members at Spartanburg Methodist Church. We will fill bags and backpacks- "Agape Bags"- with items needed by unhoused people in both Anderson and Clemson. We will distribute 50 Agape Bags in partnership with *A Taste of Joy* in Anderson and 12 Agape Bags in partnership with *Clemson Community Care* in Clemson.

Another great resource is the *Daily Prayer Guide 2025*. It is available for purchase at https://wwfaith.org. Click on MENU in the top right, and then under *Resources* click on *Shop and Download*. There is contact information that enables you to ask about the Daily Prayer Guide. The guide follows the lectionary. If your minister also follows the lectionary, the Daily Prayer Guide will prepare you for the sermon on Sunday. I have used it this year and have enjoyed it.

Two other excellent resources are the Program Guide that gives many helpful suggestions for circle meetings and the Mission u Curriculum Book, *Practicing Hope. Practicing Hope* even counts as a book on the Reading Program. If you attend Missionu or another Bible Study taught by one of the attendees of Mission u, you also get credit for two books.

Finally, if you are not already doing so, consider participating in the Women of Faith Reading Program. The books are interesting, educational, meaningful and many of them are timely. There is a form included in this newsletter to keep a record of what you read. In Plan I, read 5 books, one in each category. In Plan II, read 10 books, two in each category. In Plan III, read 15 books, 2 s in each category and 5 in any category. In Plan IV, read 20 books, 2 in each category and 10 in any category. There are also 3 bonus books that count for 2 books: one in the category in which the book is listed, and then you may choose the additional category in which it is counted a second time. In addition, you may watch 2 Faith Talks and count it as 1 book. If you attended Legislative Advocacy Day or the Conference trip to the Penn Center, each event also counts as 1 book. There are also movies that count as a book (or you can read the book): *The Hate You Give, Hidden Figures*, and *Push Out*.

Please use the official form and mail it to me or give it to me in person by August 15 to ensure

your name appears in the program.



Housing: Resident participants will be housed in college dormitories. You need a pillow, bed linen (college dorms style twin bed is longer length than a regular twin bed. Two flat sheets will be better than a fitted sheet), bath linen, bathmat, soap, flashlight, raingear, Bible, water bottle, pens, notebook, trash bags, jacket or sweater, tote bag/bookbag for Bible and study book and other items necessary for your comfort away from home for a few days. (Classrooms and dorm rooms may be cold. Bring appropriate linens and clothing.)

Please bring cash or a checkbook for shopping in the craft room and resource room. Credit cards are not accepted.


