

Thank you to all the Local Unit Secretaries that attended the Officers Training on January 25th. For any Local Unit Secretaries or units without a secretary who were unable to attend officer training. Below is the information for Secretaries that was shared.

UWFaith Unit Secretary Duties and Responsibilities

As Secretary of your Unit, you are a member of the Administrative Team and Executive Team. You are responsible to take minutes of your Administrative Meetings, Executive Meetings and Unit Meetings. Your minutes should include all members attending, the time your meeting started and ended, any motions made during your meetings along with who made the motion and who seconded the motion. Keep in mind as you are taking minutes, use wording such as "a discussion was had about" ... rather than using specific names so

that privacy can be maintained.

The minutes should be made available to your Unit President as soon as possible after each meeting. Upon approval of your Unit President, the Executive minutes should be shared with the Executive Members and the Unit minutes should be shared with all Members.

You are responsible for keeping your minutes on file either digitally or as a hard copy. You are also responsible for keeping a list of you officers and a copy of financial records from each meeting.

You are also responsible for sending a list of elected and appointed leader of your unit, including addresses, ZIP codes, telephone numbers, and emails, to the district President or Secretary within ten (10) days of their election and interim changes immediately.

It would also be helpful, but not required, to make available to all Unit Members a list of members and their contact information.

United Women in Faith Handbook 2025-2028 Constitution & Bylaws

The secretary will be informed about the program and the total involvement of the local unit in order to perform the responsibilities assigned to her and to assist the president.

She will:

- a. Keep accurate minutes of all meetings of the unit and its leadership team and give notice of these meetings.
- b. Serve as custodian of all records and official documents.
- c. Maintain minutes and local documents/records for two (2) quadrennia (the preceding and the current). Archive older minutes and records with the district United Methodist archives per the General Commission on Archives and History recommendations. Electronic or physical records may be archived as is the preference of the archival site.
- d. Sign all official, legal, and financial documents, making certain each is properly dated.
- e. Keep an accurate roll of membership
- f. Send a list of elected and appointed leaders of the unit, including addresses, ZIP codes, telephone numbers, and emails, to the secretary of the district organization within ten (10) days of the election and interim changes immediately.
- g. Serve on the leadership team, finance committee, and other committees as necessary

Missed the Officer's Training on January 25, 2025? No worries! Some of our units do not have an E&I Coordinator. Therefore, the information provided here will also serve as a guide for Unit Presidents.

Education & Interpretation Coordinator Local Unit Duties of Mission

Promote the use of the Response Magazine and Prayer Calendars, encourage your unit to become a Mission Today Unit.

Give to all five channels of giving: Pledge to Mission: The amount a woman gives to her local unit. It is usually the largest amount she gives every year for mission.

Special Mission Recognition: A set amount of money for mission. (\$40 for gold, \$60 for sapphire, \$100 for pearl, \$200 for emerald, \$500 for ruby, \$1,000 for diamond, and \$2,000 for two diamonds.) Gift to Mission:

Honor someone with a contribution of \$5 or more for mission. A card may be sent to the honoree: Congratulations, Thank You, Special Day, Thinking of You, Happy Birthday, or A Baby. Gift in Memory: A gift of \$5 or more that honors the memory of someone special. A card can be sent to the family of the deceased.

World Thank Offerings: Spontaneous gifts given out of gratitude for God's abundance. World Thank Offerings are usually collected in the fall by the local unit in a special Service of Thanksgiving. This should be an (E & I Program).

Unit presidents receive in their package or report forms mission studies. Please provide the number of attendees at the conference Mission U, District Mission studies, whether attended in person or virtually.

Promote the Legacy Fund: The Legacy Endowment Fund of United Women in Faith is a permanently invested endowment that supports the work of improving the lives of women, children, and youth at home and abroad.

Promote and use printed United Women in Faith materials: Audiovisuals and websites, both National and Conference: uwfaithresources.org Attend and encourage others to attend the District and Conference events: District Events, Leadership Training, Day Apart Spring into Mission, Annual Meeting. Conference Events, Spiritual Growth Mission U Annual Meeting.

Note: You have the primary responsibility for interpreting and promoting Mission Giving in your Local Unit. Use all your creativity to help other members of United Women in Faith understand: (1) Each of our five channels of Mission Giving; (2) The journey of the mission dollar; (3) How mission dollars are used at the Local, District, Conference, National, and international levels; and (4) The concept of "The Total Program Is Mission."
