We arrived in time for our 1:00 tour of the Penn Center cultural center and museum celebrating the Gullah Geechee and African American history. It started as a school for freed slaves. We saw a short movie about the Gullah Geechee community. The room was overflowing, and it was great to see several children and teens among the audience. The museum was fascinating, andwe all found items to purchase in the museum store. Several of us bought books


We checked in to our Bed and Breakfast there on the grounds. It was a beautiful old house with one bedroom downstairs and four upstairs, each with twin beds. All the floors (except the black and white tile kitchen), walls and ceilings were dark wood. We had a living room, dining room, kitchen and three bathrooms. The large front porch had 8 chairs (some were rockers) facing live oak trees with Spanish moss. We were able to get some exercise after our long ride by walking around the grounds. We were so glad we stayed there instead of at a hotel! That evening we went to Seaside Bar and Grill on the island. It was great food and service — highly recommend! After dinner we went back to our B&;B and played Yahtzee and UNO. Fun!


Sunday morning, we had breakfast at the house and then attended church at the Brick Baptist Church, just down the road from our B&B and still on the Penn Center grounds. The church was built by slaves in 1855. The black church was so warm and welcoming. It was a wonderful service. We really enjoyed the music.


Next, we were off to Charleston to visit the new International African American Museum. We had timed tickets for 3 p.m. The museum is quite impressive. It's near the harbor and the Aquarium. There was a lot of information about the Gullah Geechee culture and a lot of exhibits of art and history.

We couldn't go to Charleston without a visit to the Market. It was a quick run through, but we enjoyed it. The sweetgrass baskets are very expensive now, but one vendor did have hers on sale. We got to see several carriages going by with beautiful horses. Dinner was at Henry's, another good seafood place with other dishes to satisfy all of us. Before we left Charleston, Cherie drove us by the Battery to look at the stately houses. The view of the harbor was mostly blocked.

We arrived back home around 11:15 p.m. We were so grateful for safe travel and for Cherie's music playlist to sign along with. It was a weekend jam-packed with learning, fun, fellowship, and worship. We wish you all could have been there with us!









GULLAH GEECHEE

Gullah Geechee communities developed in coastal and interior regions of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, and northern Florida—areas with large plantation systems and enslaved populations in the 1700s and 1800s. By the 1900s, large numbers of African Americans with roots in these regions migrated to southern, northern, and western cities, while others remained in rural communities. To honor the significance of this regional culture and its national and international connections, Congress established the Gullah Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor in 2006.







Anderson District Annual Training


Bonnie Surface, Vice President



Secretary of Educational Resources (Reading Program)

Several educational resources are available to members of United Women in Faith You can find them on the United Women in Faith Website. Since January 1 this year, I've enjoyed using the Daily Prayer Guide 2025. In the Guide there is a bit of information for each day of the week.

Sunday – Usually a brief statement and art

Monday – A reflection

Tuesday - An example of how our funds are being used

Wednesday – Mid-week prayer request

Thursday - Thought and prayer for the day

Friday – Birthdays for the week

Saturday - Notes from the week

For each day there are two lectionary scripture readings. There is also a program prayer request.

We have a Program Resource Guide, *Carrying Our Faith Forward*. It has lots of ideas for circle programs. We also have a calendar. In addition, the curriculum for Mission u. Practicing Hope is available. This curriculum is excellent. I hope you will plan to attend Mission u this year in July at Spartanburg Methodist College. If you read the curriculum, you get credit for one book on our Reading Program. If you attend Mission u, you get credit for a second book.

Participating in our Reading Program brings me great joy. Our books are interesting, and many are transformative. Find all the details on UWFaith website. This is the last year to read books on the 2021 Reading Program List. There are 3 books from that list that I want to suggest you read. Dinner by Candlelight, Women Rise, and Right Here Right Now.

A book from the 2024 list that I highly recommend is *The Three Mothers: How the Mothers of Marti Luther King. Jr., Malcolm X, and James Baldwin Shaped a Nation.* -----

If you attended the SC Conference sponsored trip to the Penn Center on Feb. 15 and 16, you may count it as one book. If you attend Legislative Advocacy Day on March 18. You may count it as one book.


