Course Descriptions

- **Lay Servant Basic Course** – The required course for all beginners to Lay Servant Ministries. Also serves as a refresher course for those who wish to be recertified.
 - **Called to Preach** – For those who have not completed formal preaching training, for pastors seeking a basic refresher, and others who are called upon to preach in a pastor's absence.
 - **Leading in Evangelism** – Connects witness with spiritual formation, leading participants to a greater understanding of the importance of evangelism for all involved. Incorporates Wesleyan insights for a 21st-century audience.
 - **God's Mission...Our Journey** – Provides better understanding of a holistic approach to participation in God's mission to the world and equips lay servants for more effective missional engagement in their communities and beyond.
 - **Opening Ourselves to Grace** – Helps lay servant leaders embrace and communicate Wesleyan understanding of basic Christian practices (works of piety, mercy) as means of grace.
 - **Ministry With the Forgotten** – Help lay servant ministers understand dementia from a spiritual standpoint and become more comfortable ministering with people affected by dementia. (Zoom)
