Please try to review this passage ahead of time.

Registration check-in will be October 24 from 2:00pm-5:00pm in the space right outside of the

sanctuary. There will be various displays and information tables including information on next year's **National Assembly** being held in Indianapolis, Indiana on May 15-17. If you would like to bring a display, please let me know in advance, so we can save a spot for it.

We didn't sell all the snacks, but the kids at Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg's Day Camp benefitted from what we didn't sell. We had one dissatisfied customer who was unhappy there wasn't any pickles or chow-chow. Can we make her happy next year? Although we didn't make as much of a "profit" as last year, we made \$660. That's \$165.00 for each of the four Mission Projects: Bethlehem Center, Spartanburg; Columbia Bethlehem Community Center; Killingsworth; and Wallace Family Life Center.

WFLC Updates: Building Community Through Service and Leadership

The Wallace Family Life Center (WFLC) Board convened for its fourth bi-monthly meeting on July 25th at the center, marking another milestone in the organization's commitment to serving the community. During this productive session, board members made key decisions that will shape the center's direction and discussed comprehensive plans for future initiatives. August Food Drive Focuses on School-Age Nutrition

It was great seeing everyone at Mission u in Spartanburg. I would like to thank the units that shared books for the resource room. It was nice to have books for ladies to look and consider reading.


